

CODE OF CONDUCT OFFENCE

The following process applies when either or both umpires, Secretaries of Clubs participating in the match, a player participating in a match, members of the Senior and Junior sub-committees or the Conducts Commissioner believe that an alleged breach of the Code of Behaviour may have occurred.

Umpire/s inform captain of a report of a player as soon as practicable after the close of day's play. Umpire completes prescribed Umpires Report Form and sends copy plus any further written submission to the Rules Co-ordinator by 7.00pm on the Tuesday after the completion of the match. The grade of the offence must be included in the report. Note: The Commissioner encourages reports to be forwarded after the first week of a match.

A player or official may report an alleged breach of the Code of Behaviour by providing a written submission to the Rules Co-ordinator through the Club Secretary by 7.00pm on the Tuesday following the completion of the match. Note: The Commissioner encourages reports to be forwarded after the first week of a match.

The Rules Co-ordinator may lodge a report or instigate an investigation within 48 hours of becoming aware of any facts, which are capable of substantiating a breach under the Code of Behaviour

The Rules Co-ordinator refers all such matters to the Conducts Commissioner for investigation and determination and forwards copy of complaint to the Secretary of the offending Club.

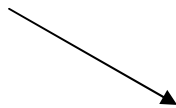
Level 1 and 2: The Conducts Commissioner makes a determination as to the Level of the offence based on the guidelines in Section 47 of TCI Rules and Regulations. Level 1 and Level 2 offences may be determined by the Commissioner who may resolve the issue with the player/s and invoke options outlined Section 47 of TCI Rules and Regulations. Penalties may be varied for repeat offenders.

The Commissioner will contact Player / Players concerned as soon as possible. If the Player / Players plead Guilty the Commissioner hands down sentence and advises the Secretary who in turn advises the Club / Clubs.

Level 3 and other unclear matters will be referred by the Commissioner to the Judiciary Committee which meets as soon as possible after being convened. The Judiciary Committee may impose any penalty it sees fit. The Judiciary Committee may vary the level of the offence. Penalties may be varied for repeat offenders

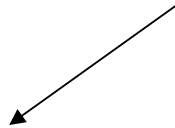


Findings of the Commissioner / Judiciary Committee will clearly define timeframes of suspensions be it for 1 day or 2 day matches. The findings will be forwarded to the Secretary who advises the relevant Club/s and Portfolio Chairs and places on File. In the event of a Suspension , the Secretary advises all Clubs of the Outcome.



Player accepts ruling, no further action required

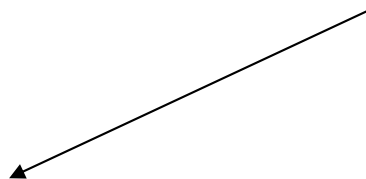
Player rejects ruling and advises Club Secretary of an Appeal. This information is conveyed to the Secretary within 7 days. The Secretary and Rules Co-ordinator convene the Appeals Tribunal. The suspended player cannot play until the appeal has been heard



The Appeals tribunal hears and determines each appeal by reference only to documentary and written evidence presented to the Judiciary Committee hearing together with the Findings Sheet and summary of outcomes from the hearing and shall receive from all interested parties written submissions only with respect to the evidence and submissions presented before the initial hearing. The Appeals Tribunal's decision will be conveyed to the Secretary who advises relevant Club/s and Portfolio Chairs



The complainant person/club request the Administrator to refer the "Appeals Tribunal's" decision to QCCA for review. The QCCA decision will be final
